## **DOYLE**

John Doyle was born around 1816<sup>1</sup> in Manchester, England. He was convicted on the 9 April 1832<sup>2</sup> for stealing, for this crime he was sentenced to seven years transportation to Australia. He left on the ship *Planter* on the 13 June 1832.<sup>3</sup> When he arrived at Sydney Cover on the 13 October 1832,<sup>4</sup> he as assigned to William Barnes in the district of Patterson in the Hunter River area of New South Wales.<sup>5</sup>

John was granted his ticket of leave 2 October 1837<sup>6</sup> and his certificate of Freedom 29 December 1841.<sup>7</sup>

John Married Ann Graham on the 5 August 1845,<sup>9</sup> at this stage it is uncertain of how many children were born to John & Ann but seven are known.

John Doyle 23 September 1844 - 27 January 1845 and is buried in the Glebe Cemetery, Maitland. George Doyle 15 December 1845 - 6 June 1911. John, Ann and George moved to Queensland, prior to the birth of Ann Jane in Ipswich 21 July 1848 - 18 October 1928. Ann Jane Married George Edward Bird 13 April 1868 and are both buried in the Moggill Cemetery, Henry Edward 26 July 1851 - 30 June 1920, James 20 October 1853, John James 2 May 1856 - 14 June 1905, and Francis (Fanny) 12 December 1860 - 25 December 1926.

Around 1856, the family moved to Moggill. After settling in Moggill, John tried his hand as a farmer of various crops including bearded wheat, <sup>19</sup> but the crop he was best known for was tobacco, which was reported to be well regarded, <sup>20</sup> and he was also involved in the timber industry. <sup>21</sup>

Not long after settling in the Moggill area, the Doyle's had a large involvement in the social activities such as sports days,<sup>22</sup> ploughing competition,<sup>23</sup> as well as boat trips for the Hibernian Society for the celebrations of St Patick's day.<sup>24</sup> These boat trips were from Brisbane & Ipswich to Doyle's Wharf, which was located at the junction of Pullen Pullen Creek and the Brisbane River, where John Doyle first acquired land, 47 Acres on Pullen Pullen Creek.<sup>25</sup> Doyle Wharf was used frequently by Steamers from Brisbane and Ipswich.

Ann died on 17 May 1897 and John died on the 24 March 1898, both are buried in the Moggill Cemetery. Unfortunately, their graves are now unmarked, due to the removal of their head stones. John James Doyle is also buried at Moggill Cemetery.<sup>26</sup>

Their son George (22) married Julia Splain (21?) on 1 February 1868,<sup>27</sup> and settled in Rafting Ground Road, Brookfield. They were said to have raised nine children, eight of which are known.

George 28 April 1869 – 30 March 1902.<sup>28</sup> Records show that George Doyle, who became a Police Officer was born at Moggill Creek, Brookfield, this was hotly disputed by his Father, who stated that he was born at his Grandfather's residence at Pullen Pullen creek on the above date. George Doyle and Mr Dahlke were said to have been murdered by bush rangers on Easter Day, 1902 at Lethbridge Pocket, near the head of the Warrego River and there is a monument to George Doyle and Mr Dahlke locate in the Tamrookum Cemetery, only a few kilometres outside of Beaudesert. Legacy of George Doyle was the naming of a Police Vessel "George Doyle" on 30 June 1995, in recognition of his service as a police officer.
